THOSE SHOCKING SHAKING DAYS is a radical and uncompromising film essay about the (im)possibility of depicting the atrocities of war. Taking

the Bosnian war (1992-1995) as a starting point, artist Selma Doborac confronts us with our position as both onlooker and image-consumer in a way that's shocking indeed, although not quite in the way you might expect. Experiencing this workis as emotionally confronting as it is intellectually challenging.

After a break, we will show NUIT ET BROUILLARD (1956) by Alain Resnais, a short documentary made ten years after the liberation of the Nazi concentration camps in Auschwitz and Majdanec. The film exposes a radically different approach to the representation of evil, historically echoing the questions and ideas that manifest themselves in our feature film.
